Amor's response to migrant caravan concerns in Tijuana

Amor is carefully observing the situation at the Tijuana/San Diego border involving the migrant caravan from Central America. Border crossing operations were disrupted for short periods of time twice in November at the San Ysidro crossing. As the temporary migrant encampment is no longer located in the vicinity of a border crossing, Amor will resume normal border-crossing procedures. For groups working in Baja California, this means crossing through the San Ysidro, Otay, or Tecate borders.

Amor focuses on long-term solutions to keeping families together. Migrants all over the world are in perilous positions of being separated from families and in situations which make them more vulnerable. We build homes alongside the local church to address the dignity and economy of a family in order to address some of the situations which might cause a family to separate.

We are having discussions with Mexican government officials in the state of Baja California Norte and the City of Tijuana and as always, we are in close consultation with the Mexican pastors who guide our work to both stay up-to-date on the communities in which we work and the work of their churches in serving their city.
