PASSPORTS

Mexico requires a valid passport or passport card to enter.

At the present time, Mexico only randomly stops auto traffic entering the country. People entering Mexico through voluntary declaration are required to present their passport.

MEXICAN AUTO INSURANCE

Drivers should purchase Mexican auto insurance online or before crossing the border.

Mexican auto insurance is a requirement.

TRAILERS

At this time there are no restrictions on trailer size or style. Trailers must have plates and proof of current registration.

BOX TRUCKS

Box trucks are considered commercial vehicles and Amor is unable to help box trucks cross into Mexico.

To reduce the volume of gear you are bringing into Mexico, we suggest renting tools and using La Cocina or Baja Camp Cooks for camp meals and tent rental.

COMING BY BUS

Whether you bring your own bus or hire a charter company, all buses that cross into Tijuana are required to use the San Ysidro, or “Main” border crossing.

These are the current procedures for crossing by bus for your Amor Mission trip:

- An Amor Representative will go with you to the border to help facilitate the crossing and escort you to camp.
- When the bus arrives at the border, all the baggage must be taken off the bus and each person must carry their own bag through the customs building.
- Save time by completing and printing out an FMME prior to your arrival.
- After going through the customs check, you will get back on the bus and we will continue on to camp.

SUPPORT VEHICLE

Groups should have at least one support vehicle in Mexico if using buses.

Amor representatives are able to lead a medical evacuation if needed, but groups must drive the injured party to the hospital in their own vehicles.

US CHARTER BUSES

Charter buses can provide pick-up from your home city, the San Diego airport, or other locations and take you across the border to camp.

Once you’ve made reservations, please let your Amor Trip Coordinator know so that we can plan accordingly.

MEXICAN BUS RENTAL

For transport to/from the worksite each day, Amor works with local buses who operate in Tijuana, referred to as “Factory Buses”. The “Factory Buses” can be used for \$150/day, and seats up to 45 people.
